Luke 22:31-34 CEV

John 1:10-13 NLT

10 He came into the very world He created, but the world didn't recognize Him. 11 He came to His own people, and even they rejected Him. 12 But to all who believed Him and accepted Him, <u>He gave the right to become children of God.</u>

Living A Grateful Life...

1. Use your rights to be a good witness...not a burden.

2 Thessalonians 3:6-12 Message

6 Our orders — backed up by the Master, Jesus — are to refuse to have anything to do with those among you who are lazy and refuse to work the way we taught you. Don't permit them to freeload on the rest. 7 We showed you how to pull your weight when we were with you, so get on with it. 8 We didn't sit around on our hands expecting others to take care of us. In fact, we worked our fingers to the bone, up half the night moonlighting so you wouldn't be burdened with taking care of us. 9 And it wasn't because we didn't

<u>have a right to your support</u>; we did. We simply wanted to provide an example of diligence, hoping it would prove contagious. 10 Don't you remember the rule we had when we lived with you? <u>"If you don't work, you don't eat."</u> 11 And now we're getting

reports that a bunch of lazy good-for-nothings are taking advantage of you. 12 This must not be tolerated. We command them to get to work immediately no excuses, no arguments — and earn their own keep.

2. Give up your right to jump ship.

Acts 27:23-26 TLB

23 "For last night an angel of the God to whom I belong and whom I serve stood beside me 24 and said, 'Don't be afraid, Paul-for you will surely stand trial before Caesar!
What's more, *God has <u>granted</u> your request and will save the lives of all* those sailing with you.' 25 So take courage! For I believe God! It will be just as he said!
26 But we will be shipwrecked on an island."

3. Use your rights of ownership to be generous.

Matthew 20:15 NIV Don't I have <u>the right</u> to do what I want with my own money? Or are you envious because I am generous?'

4. Set aside your privileges to accomplish His purposes.

Philippians 2:5-8 Message

5 Think of yourselves the way Christ Jesus thought of Himself. 6 He had equal status with God but didn't think so much of Himself that He had to cling to the advantages of that status no matter what. 7 Not at all. When the time came, <u>He set aside the privileges</u> of deity and took on the status of a slave, became human! 8 Having become human, He stayed human. It was an incredibly humbling process. <u>He didn't claim special privileges.</u> Instead, He lived a selfless, obedient life and then died a selfless, obedient death and the worst kind of death at that: a crucifixion.
